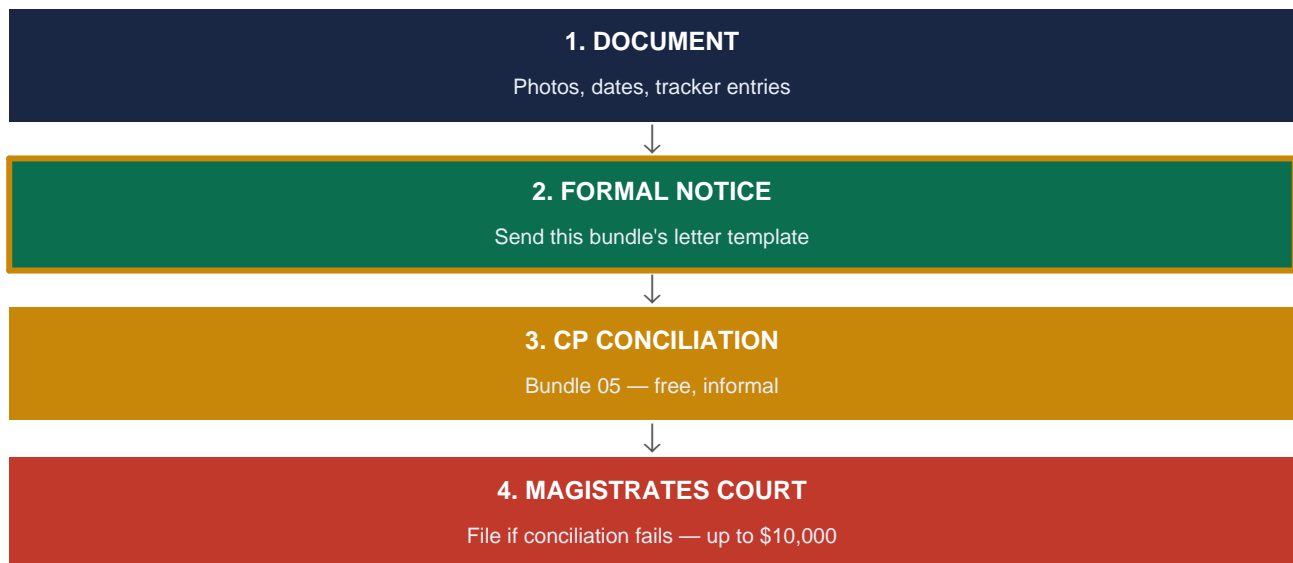
WHEN TO USE THIS BUNDLE

Use this bundle when you need to transfer your lease to someone else or sublet part of the property.

KNOW THE LAW — CONSENT TO ASSIGNMENT OR SUBLETTING

The landlord cannot unreasonably withhold consent to assign your lease or sublet part of the property. A refusal without reasonable grounds can be challenged, ultimately at the Magistrates Court.

HOW THE SYSTEM WORKS — YOUR ESCALATION PATH



The highlighted box shows where this bundle fits in the journey.

- 01 Provide a credible proposed assignee**
Stable income, rental history, and references make a refusal harder to justify.
- 02 Send the request in writing**
Set a clear response deadline.
- 03 Keep paying rent and meeting obligations**
You remain liable for rent and damage until the assignment is formally completed in writing.
- 04 Respond to any unreasonable refusal in writing**
Ask for the specific reasonable grounds relied on.
- 05 Escalate if needed**
Use Bundle 05 to progress to Consumer Protection WA conciliation or the Magistrates Court.

IF YOU NEED TO ESCALATE — WHAT MAGISTRATES COURT CAN ORDER

The Magistrates Court can order that consent be treated as given where a refusal was unreasonable.

★ GOOD TO KNOW — NEVER STOP PAYING RENT OR VACATE EARLY

Until the assignment is formally completed in writing, you remain fully liable under the existing tenancy.

■ CRITICAL — YOU REMAIN LIABLE UNTIL THE ASSIGNMENT IS FORMALLY COMPLETED

Never stop paying rent or vacate early based on an informal agreement — get it in writing first.
